An intimate, behind-the-scenes, celebration of beloved The Office co-stars Jenna Fischer and Angela Kinsey's friendship.



CHILDREN'S SUMMER READING PROGRAM: SADDLE UP & READ!

This year's summer reading theme is Saddle Up & Read!, a wild west theme to bring out the joy of reading of all ages. Free events will be held on Tuesdays in June at 2:00 in the large community room at the Graves County Public Library. This year our events include animals, magic, and science.

Children can earn gold coins for reading throughout the summer and may exchange these coins for fun items from our General Store. The General Store will have items that range from slap bracelets to figurines, and will have large prizes for the most avid readers. We will use the ReaderZone app to record what is read and how many books children check out. This app is also used for teen and adult summer reading.

The purpose of the summer reading program is to promote literacy skills, provide continued access to books and learning tools, and encourage reading as an enjoyable activity. Children who do not read during the summer can lose up to two months of learning by the time they return to school. Those who continue to read at least six books when school is out also perform better in reading and math when they return in the fall. We thank the "Friends of the Library" for sponsoring these events. We invite you and your family to visit the library to experience our summer reading program!

The library in February had a Ellis Wilson celebration in collaboration with the Jackson Purchase Historical Society and the Graves/Mayfield Art Guild. He was a famous African American artist that grew up in Mayfield.
